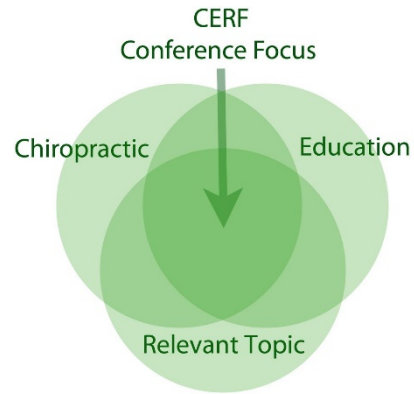
INFORMATION ABOUT THE CERF CONFERENCE

Conference proceedings: Research abstracts will be published in *The Journal of Chiropractic Education*.

Conference format: For the June 25(26), 2022 conference, there are 3 sessions. Each session has 3 parts, which contribute to building chiropractic education research capacity.

1. Invited presentations, tutorials, or workshop

These invited presentations focus on knowledge and skill building for the topic of the conference.

2. Abstract Presentations: Scholarship of Discovery

The best abstracts are selected through blinded peer review. Each research/abstract presentation focuses on the theme of the conference. Each presenter provides a 6-minute video presentation, after this, moderated questions are answered by the presenters in a live video format. The Research/Abstracts builds capacity in the ***scholarship of discovery***. The ***scholarship of discovery*** expands our current knowledge.

3. Panel Discussion: Scholarship of Application

The presenting authors, CERF Board members, and invited speakers participate in a live panel discussion to address issues related to chiropractic education and the conference theme. Attendees provide input via chat. After the conference, the panelists generate a position paper. The panel discussion builds capacity in the ***scholarship of application***. The ***scholarship of application*** is when we translate knowledge and theory into practical interventions to help solve problems.
